	The VicSuper Flexible Income Equity Growth investment option returned 23.13% (21.35% for Flexible Income with TTR feature) over the 12 months to 31 December 2019. 2019 provided strong returns across most major asset classes. While there was some volatility in markets due to fears of a global recession, the US and China trade dispute and Brexit uncertainty, central banks' overall supportive policies provided a significant tailwind for investment markets. International and Australian shares led individual asset class returns within each option, though most major asset classes delivered solid gains over the year.
